Subject: IFAA European Field Archery Championships 2009

Dear Archers,

2009 promises to be a very special year for the WFAA. We will be hosting the IFAA European Field Archery Championships (EFAC) at Tal-y-Coed, near Abergavenny. Wales has only ever hosted a major IFAA tournament on one other occasion, way back in 1980 and only a few remain shooting who took part in that tournament at Merthyr Mawr, near Bridgend.

The 2009 EFAC will take place from the 27th to the 31st of July. The tournament will feature 2 Field Rounds, 2 Hunter rounds and a Marked Paper Face Animal round. The EFAC website has been created to let everyone know what exactly the EFAC will offer. It also contains useful information about the surrounding area, accommodation, directions to the EFAC site etc. You can also register on the EFAC website using debit or credit card via Paypal or you can download and print a paper entry form if you prefer to pay by cheque or postal order.

There is no qualification criteria to enter this tournament but all entrants must be a member of an IFAA affiliated governing body (WFAA for Wales, EFAA for England, SFAA for Scotland, IFAF for Northern Ireland and the Republic of Ireland).

The registration costs will increase as the tournament draws closer so if you are planning to enter the tournament, you will save money by registering as soon as possible. Also, estimates for the other IFAA delegates suggest that the attendance will be high (400 archers+) and we can only accommodate 450 archers. Therefore, registering early will ensure you are not disappointed.
